

## **OPERATION BY PEDESTRIANS**

Pedestrians first of all press either button (there are two) which immediately lights up a WAIT sign just above the button. After an interval the WAIT sign will go out and a sign reading CROSS will appear on the opposite side of the crossing. All traffic must stop. Pedestrians then have right of way. Soon the CROSS sign will begin to flash. During this period drivers must give way to pedestrians, but may pass if no one is on the crossing. When flashing becomes faster it means the CROSS sign is about to go out and drivers will have right of way.





WHEN NO SIGNALS ARE SHOWING, ROAD TRAFFIC HAS PRIORITY

## SIGNALS TO PEDESTRIANS

PEDESTRIANS SHOULD NOT CROSS UNTIL CROSS SIGNAL APPEARS.



WHEN CROSS SIGNAL APPEARS

- AS ILLUSTRATED PEDESTRIANS SHOULD CROSS.



CROSS SIGNAL STARTS TO FLASH.

PEDESTRIANS STILL HAVE RIGHT OF WAY BUT SHOULD CROSS WITH CARE. THE CROSS SIGNAL WILL FLASH FASTER JUST BEFORE GOING OUT.



## SIGNALS TO DRIVERS

PULSATING AMBER LIGHT: TRAFFIC MUST STOP, UNLESS UNSAFE TO DO SO.

RED PULSA ALL TRAFFI GIVING RIGI TO PEDESTI

RED PULSATING STOP LIGHT; ALL TRAFFIC MUST STOP, GIVING RIGHT OF WAY TO PEDESTRIANS.

FLASHING AMBER LIGHT GIVES RIGHT OF WAY TO PEDESTRIANS, BUT TRAFFIC IS ABLE TO PROCEED IF CROSSING IS CLEAR.

Note: A pulsating light varies in incensity but done not go one.

A fleshing light goes off and on.

Easily recognisable,
the new traffic signal at
PANDA CROSSINGS is always
accompanied by triangular shaped
black and white markings across the
road: those on Zebra crossings
are rectangular. In addition, the
post carries a yellow globe with
black horizontal stripes. Two panels
on the signal post each carry a
push-button for pedestrians to press
when they want to cross.
